

Ruach, Ruach by Paul G. Barnsley


“Who is the Holy Spirit? What does He do?

something new – something **for everybody**.


Ezekiel gives us the image of God’s Spirit

Testament at Pentecost.


Later Paul explains the promises of sonship and

sacrifice of worship.




**Ruach, Ruach,

Empowering me anew.**




**He was involved at the start of creation

As God's sons He helps us cry "Abba"!**




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
